CALL FOR APPLICATIONS AND NOMINATIONS OF PERSONS TO SERVE ON PRIVATE SECURITY INDUSTRY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Private Security Industry Regulatory Authority (PSiRA) with its head office in Pretoria, Centurion is a statutory body established in terms of the Private Security Industry Regulation Act, 2001 (Act No.56 of 2001) to regulate the private security industry in South Africa. PSiRA is looking for dynamic, experienced, and suitably qualified professionals to serve on its Private Security Industry Advisory Committee, which is a sub-committee of the PSiRA Council.

The Authority invites applications from experienced and suitably qualified individuals for appointment as Independent Chairperson and two (2) deputies and ordinary Members of the Private Security Industry Advisory Committee. Applicants should ideally be qualified and experienced in any of the following sectors of the private security industry, with no less than **10 years** working experience:

- Guarding Sector;
- Close Protection Sector;
- Electronics Security Sector;
- Private Investigations Sector;
- Security Training Sector; or
- Locksmith Sector

Role of the Sector Committee

The Private Security Industry Advisory Committee is a sub-committee of Council established in terms of section 13(2) of the Private Security Industry Regulation Act, 2001 and fulfills its role in terms of Council approved Terms of Reference (Charter).

The role of the Committee will include the following:

- Provide advice to Council on strategies and policies matters that will support and improve the PSiRA's relationship with its stakeholders and promote/strengthen its communication strategy;
- Advise on key strategies and policies matters critical to the development of industry sector standards and training standards;
- Identify skills development requirements for the sector;
- Advise on key strategies and policy matters critical to improving industry compliance within the sector;
- Advise Council of areas of potential instability within the private security industry,
- Advise Council on the development of regulations critical for improved industry compliance and regulation.
- Identify and advise Council on the development of standards within the sector, including standards of occupational conduct, etc;
- Recommend research projects that are aimed at promoting the interest of the private security industry and improve the regulatory framework of the sector;
- Identify and advise Council on the development of security services within the respective sectors;
- Advise Council of the promotion, empowerment and advancement of person who are historically disadvantaged;

- Advise and report on the implementation of the transformation imperatives for the private security industry;
- Advise on areas to promote, maintain, and protect the status of the occupation within the sector;
- Advise Council on standards developed or under development for the private security industry.

Knowledge and Experience: The prospective candidates must come with high pedigree of competency and experience in the sector in which they aspire to serve.

Persons applying for appointment as Independent Chairperson and deputies must not have a direct or indirect financial or personal interest in the private security industry; or represent or be a member of a body representing the interests of employers or employees in the private security industry or security officers or any security business.

The ordinary members of the committee must be nominated representatives representing the interests of the following stakeholders:

- Private Security Employer Associations,
- Private Security Organised labour
- State Security Agency,
- Government Security Regulator;
- Safety and Security Civil Society Organisations;
- Safety and Security Education and Training Institutions;

Qualification and experience in Security Management or other related field shall be an added advantage.

Remuneration: The remuneration of committee members shall be determined by Council guided by National Treasury Tariffs Guidelines for Office Bearers of Statutory Bodies and shall in terms section 8(6) of the PSiR Act, 2001 be approved by the Minister of Police.
